**Committee:** Increasing attacks on scholars and scholar-activists have highlighted that academic freedom policies are not up to date with 21st century technology and means of public engagement. Worse, it appears that universities are unable, or perhaps unwilling, to jeopardize their reputations and donations in effectively defending the academic freedom and free speech of public scholars. All public scholars and intellectual activists face the risk of the public “talking back,” but these risks are heightened for women, people of color, and, especially, women of color. This interactive workshop will provide academics the tools necessary to support and protect public scholars and intellectual activists, with particular attention to what departments, universities, and professional organizations can do. The workshop centers on the consequences of engaging the public on issues that are particularly controversial -- namely inequality and exclusion.
